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Vermont Retirement Systems Seek Member for Medical Review Board

Background

Vermont has three public retirement systems—the Vermont State Teachers' Retirement System (VSTRS), Vermont Municipal Employees Retirement System (VMERS) or Vermont State Employees Retirement System (VSERS). These three systems collectively designate a Medical Review Board (MRB) to review applications for disability retirement benefits.

The MRB is comprised of three physicians and is assisted by staff from the Retirement Division. The MRB is responsible for the collection, arrangement, and approval of disability applications, and it reports its findings in writing to the Retirement Boards.

Position

Member of the Medical Review Board. Applicants must be a licensed physician.

Job Description

The role of the Medical Review Board is to determine whether a member who has applied for a disability retirement is mentally or physically incapacitated for the further performance of the member's specific job requirements, and whether that person's condition is likely to be permanent. This position may encounter various types of scenarios resulting in varying levels of medical documentation and review. A typical case load consists of 4-6 cases per month for review. A stipend for each case where a decision is rendered will be paid.

The ideal candidate must:

- Communicate in a respectful, civil manner and regularly utilize active listening skills and have a strong attention to detail.
- Not be eligible to participate in VSTRS, VMERS, or VSERS.
- Able to meet the third Thursday of each month.
- Able to attend meetings remotely.
- Have basic familiarity with computers and/or other technologies.
