

Vermont Non-Profits Reunited With Money!

Five Vermont non-profits received an unexpected financial "gift" this December. They learned their organizations had unclaimed property. State Treasurer Beth Pearce delivered checks to the organizations that ranged in value from \$390 to \$1,700.

"There are more than 350,000 properties in the unclaimed property database," said Pearce. "Properties listed include not only individual names, but businesses and non-profit organi-

zations. In returning these claims today to these organizations, we wanted to not only support them in providing these needed services, but remind all Vermonters that they should check for any unclaimed property they may have."
