**National Association of State Treasurers Elects Spaulding as NAST President**

MONTPELIER, Vt.—Vermont State Treasurer Jeb Spaulding has been elected as president of the National Association of State Treasurers (NAST). NAST is the leading voice for state treasury issues in Washington D.C. Spaulding will serve a one-year term starting January 1.

“Vermont and all states benefit from having a strong voice on financial issues among our national policymakers,” said Spaulding. “Through NAST, state treasurers across the country can recommend action to federal officials on policy relating to pension funding, municipal bonds, investing, college savings, and other treasury activities.”

Spaulding believes NAST should develop a stronger presence in shaping federal policy. He plans to focus on building NAST’s policy outreach efforts; continue work to secure federal legislation to authorize the U.S. Treasury to work with state unclaimed property programs to find owners of matured, unredeemed savings bonds; and encourage development of more services that assist NAST members in serving their state constituents.

Spaulding has actively participated as a member of NAST since he began serving his first term as State Treasurer in 2003. Spaulding has served in various positions on the NAST Executive Committee, including currently serving as Senior Vice President.

“I’m honored to be elected NAST President and look forward to gaining experience that will enhance my skills as State Treasurer and benefit the citizens of Vermont,” said Spaulding.

The National Association of State Treasurers was founded in 1976. It is an organization of state financial leaders. NAST encourages the highest ethical standards, promotes education and the exchange of ideas, builds professional relationships, develops standards of excellence, and influences public policy for the benefit of the citizens of the states.

Spaulding was elected as President during NAST’s annual business meeting August 18-20 in Rockport, Maine.
