Jon Harris called the Thursday, March 10, 2016, meeting to order at 3:35 p.m., which was held in the Treasurer's Conference Room, fourth floor, 109 State Street, Montpelier, VT.

**ITEM 1:      **Approve the Minutes of:****

**ITEM 2:      **Discuss/Act on Disability Retirement recommendation for:****

**On motion by Mr. Mackey, seconded by Mr. Norris, the Board unanimously voted by roll call to accept the recommendation of the Medical Review Board for the disability retirement for Lynn Lord, with no further review.**

**ITEM 3: Any other business to come before the board**

The Miscellaneous Retirement Bill has been filed with the House Government Operations Committee. There is a proposal in the bill that pertains to the VSTRS program; language addressing an ability to create a safe harbor to prevent a negative COLA from being applied to retirees.

Ms. Pearce gave an update to the Board about the divestment proposal at the legislature. The Treasurer's Office has been advised that bill S.28, on the senate side, will not go forward and that a non-binding letter will be introduced. Groups, such as the VT League of Cities and Towns and the NEA, have submitted resolutions stating that they believe that legislating divestment decisions are inappropriate and that decisions should rest with VPIC. Ms. Pearce stated that there will be a VPIC sub-committee is formed to study the issue. Mr. Golonka will be appointing one person from each Retirement Board to be a representative on the VPIC sub-committee. Ms. Pearce stated that on March 18, there will be a meeting with interested parties and stakeholders to outline a process of what work would be researched.

Ms. Pearce advised the Board that the amortization finance proposal has been discussed with the House Appropriations Committee and Government Operations and she expects further review.

Mr. Harris thanked Ms. Pearce and the Treasurer's Office for all of their hard work on the divestment issue.
